

### What is a Sexually Transmitted Infection or Disease?

⇒ STI's & STD's are caused by either a Bacteria, Parasite, or Virus.







- The <u>infection</u> comes first, then the <u>disease</u>, (if the infection is not treated).
- → Viruses are <u>Incurable</u> but the <u>symptoms</u> are treatable. (i.e., HPV, HIV, & Genital Herpes)
- ⇒ 25% of the population has HPV (human papilloma virus)



- ⇒ Men having sex with men are 27 times more likely to get HIV.
- ⇒ Syphilis, Chlamydia & Gonorrhea are <u>bacterial infections</u> cured by antibiotics.
- ⇒ With Gonorrhea however, 50% of people are antibiotic resistant.
- ⇒ Chlamydia & Gonorrhea (if left untreated) can cause Pelvic Inflammatory Disease (PID) which is an infection of the reproductive system & can result in infertility.

#### How are STI's Spread?

- ⇒ Through pre-cum, semen, & vaginal fluid
- ⇒ Through open cuts, blood, & sores (skin to skin contact)
- Correct use of latex condoms <u>reduces</u> risk when used with Anal, Oral and Vagi-nal sex.
- ⇒ Pulling out during sex will NOT protect you from a STI/STD.

#### Should I get Tested?

- ⇒ If Sexually Active YES!
- ⇒ Changing Partners... YES!
- ⇒ By the time a Sexually Active Person is 25, <u>Half</u> may contract a STI/STD. (American Health Association Projection)

#### Symptoms of STI's/STD's?

- ⇒ Quite often, there are NO symptoms...

  ( Asymptomatic)
- ⇒ Bumps, sores, or warts near genital areas and/or mouth
- ⇒ Skin rash, swelling, or redness near the genital areas
- ⇒ Painful urination and/or discolored bodily fluids (discharges)

#### STI/STD Tests & Treatments

 Blood tests - Blood tests can confirm the diagnosis of <u>HIV</u> or later stages of <u>Syphilis</u>.

#### Tests & Treatments

- Urine samples- Some STI's/STD's are confirmed with a urine sample.
- Fluid samples If you have open genital sores, your doctor may test fluid and samples from the sores to diagnose the type of infection.

#### **Bacterial Infection**

Antibiotics (often in a single dose) can cure many sexually transmitted bacterial and parasitic infections including: gonorrhea, syphilis, chlamydia and trichomoniasis.

#### Viral infection

 Viral infections are managed with ointments and anti-viral medications.



#### BTW..

- Wait to have sex until 7 days after antibiotic treatment, and sores have healed.
- Women should be retested in 3 months due to possibility of reinfection.


